Find My Gas Engineer...



Gas Sure, who carry out all the Association's Gas Maintenance work, is launching a new online service where tenants can track the progress of the engineer planned to visit your home.



Whenever a service or repair call is booked with Gas Sure, customers will be given a link by email or text that allows them to see details of when the job is planned. On the day of the service, customers will receive a link giving an estimated time of the engineers arrival which will be within a 15 minute timescale. The new system will also give real time location of your engineer, so on the day customers will receive a link allowing them to track the engineer.

We know your time is important and by having live up to date information the aim is to minimise the disruption to your day as much as possible.

The service is due to go live in the coming weeks and as you book in your annual service or have to report a gas repair you will get more information then.

Grounds Maintenance

We are delighted to welcome In-Work Enterprise as our new grounds maintenance contractor who have recently started working with the Association. In-Work are a Social Enterprise which means they invest any profits back to the business and communities to provide opportunities for people who have had health issues by providing training, voluntary and work-related opportunities including landscaping and grounds maintenance. It is hoped that In-Work will be able to work with local people and individuals over the coming months.

Our Grounds Maintenance Service also includes the ability to cut tenants grass and we maintain over 120 gardens through our Garden Tidy Scheme.



The Garden Tidy Scheme is open to tenants who have reached pension age or have mobility or other issues that prevent them from being able to maintain their garden.

To apply to be part of the Garden Tidy Scheme give us a call or pop into the office to leave your details.



Bulk Uplift Service


The Association offers a bulk uplift service where tenants can arrange of the disposal of bulk items from your house. In the past year we arranged over 640 bulk uplifts from tenants.

The cost of this service is around £40,000 per year and is clearly well used. The Association has worked hard in recent years and we now spend just under half what we used to through better planning and use of contractors and how waste is dealt with.

We have noticed an increase in bulk uplift requests for items that do not necessarily need a bulk uplift. We would ask you to remember that the bulk service is really for items that do not fit in your refuse and recycling bins, for example furniture and old white goods.

Items such as bin bags of rubbish or cardboard can be disposed of using your normal wheelie bins and we would ask tenants to think about what's being disposed of before asking for a bulk uplift.

By doing so it helps to keep running costs for this valuable service as low as possible.




Investment in Homes *update*

We have just completed a programme of bathroom upgrades in the past few weeks to over 30 houses costing over £100,000 and the feedback from tenants has been excellent.

At the moment we are developing a new programme for the installation of new windows and doors and expect work to start later in the year.

In addition to this, we are also piloting some new technologies in some houses to improve the energy efficiency especially when new heating systems are being required to be fitted. This work is all part of some other investigations we are carrying out so we can better understand what is needed to make your homes cost effective to heat and to considerably reduce the carbon emissions from houses. We would like to thank those tenants who have helped us by giving access to your homes for varying works and investigations as part of this.

In the near future we will begin to share our plans and outcomes from our research as we start to think about how we play our part in reducing energy to better deal with climate change.
