Are you Ready?

Universal Credit is a new benefit for working aged people in and out of work, which will bring the following state benefits together into one monthly single payment:-

- **I Housing Benefit**
- Employment Support allowance (Income Related) ■ Income Support
- **Child Tax Credit**

- **Jobseekers Allowance** (Income Based)
- Working Tax Credit

What will I have to do to get Universal Credit?

- You will be required to have access to the internet to make a claim for Universal Credit as claimants will be expected to do this on-line.
- You will need an email address.
- You will need to have a bank account/Post Office account/Credit Union to get your Universal Credit payment. If you don't have one of these accounts, you will not receive your payment.
